FIFTH CHAPTER OF MATHEW. [Concluded.]

16. let your light so shine be-fore men, that they may see your good works, and glo-ri-fy your fa-ther which is in heav-en.

17. ¶ Think not that i am come to des-troy the law, or the prophets: i am not come to des-troy, but to ful-fil.

18. For ver-i-ly i say un-to you, till heav-en and earth pass, one jot or one titt-le shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be ful-filled.

19. Who-so-ev-er there-fore shall break one of these least co-mmand-ments, and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the king-dom of heav-en: but who-so-ev-er shall do, and teach them, the same shall be called great in the king-dom of heav-en.

20. For i say un-to you, that ex-cept your righ-teous-ness shall ex-ceed the righ-teous-ness of the scribes and phar-i-sees, ye shall in no case en-ter in-to the king-dom of heav-en.

21. ¶ Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, thou shalt not kill; and who-so-ev-er shall kill, shall be in dan-ger of the judg-ment;

22. But i say unto you, that who-so-ever is angry with his brother with-out a cause, shall be in dan-ger of the judg-ment: and who-so-ev-er shall say to his broth-er, raca, shall be in dan-ger of the coun-cil: but who-so-ev-er shall say, thou fool, shall be in dan-ger of hell-fire.

23. There-fore if thou bring thy gift to the al-tar, and there re-mem-berest that thy brother hath ought a-gainst thee,

24. Leave there thy gift be-fore the al-tar, and go thy way; first be re-con-ciled to thy broth-er, and then come and off-er thy gift.

25. A-gree with thine ad-ver-sa-ry quick-ly, while thou art in the way with him; lest at an-y time the ad-ver-sa-ry de-liv-er thee to the judge, and the judge de-liv-er thee to the off-ic-er, and thou be cast in-to pris-on.

26. Ver-i-ly i say un-to thee, thou shalt by no means come out thence, till thou hast paid the utt-er-most farth-ing.

27. ¶ Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, thou shalt not co-mmit a-dul-ter-y:

23_ Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee:

24_ Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.

25_ Agree with thine adversary quickly, whiles thou art in the way with him; lest at any time the adversary deliver thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and thou be cast into prison.

26_ Verily <u>I</u> say unto thee, <u>T</u>hou shalt by no means come out thence, till thou hast paid the uttermost farthing.

27_¶ Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery:

28. But i say un-to you, that who-so-ev-er look-eth on a wo-man to lust af-ter her, hath committ-ed a-dul-ter-y with her al-read-y in his heart.

29. And if thy right eye o-ffend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is pro-fi-ta-ble for thee that one of thy mem-bers should per-ish, and not that thy whole bod-y should be cast in-to hell.

30. And if thy right hand o-ffend thee, cut it off, and cast it from thee: for it is pro-fi-ta-ble for thee that one of thy mem-bers should per-ish, and not that thy whole bo-dy should be cast in-to hell.

31. It hath been said, who-so-ev-er shall put a-way his wife, let him give her a writ-ing of di-vorce-ment:

32. But i say un-to you, that who-so-ev-er shall put a-way his wife, sav-ing for the cause of for-ni-ca-tion, caus-eth her to co-mmit a-dul-ter-y: and who-so-ev-er shall marr-y her that is di-vorced co-mmit-teth a-dul-ter-y.

33. ¶ A-gain, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, thou shalt not for-swear thy-self, but shalt per-form un-to the Lord thine oaths.

34. But i say un-to you, swear not at all: nei-ther by heav-en, for it is God's throne:

35. Nor by the earth; for it is his foot-stool: nei-ther by Je-ru-sa-lem; for it is the cit-y of the great king.

36. Nei-ther shalt thou swear by thy head, be-cause thou canst not make one hair white or black.

37. But let your co-mmu-ni-ca-tion be, yea, yea; nay, nay; for what-so-ev-er is more than these, com-eth of ev-il.

38. \P Ye have heard that it hath been said, an eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth.

39. But i say un-to you, that ye re-sist not ev-il: but who-so-ev-er shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the oth-er al-so.

40. And if an-y man will sue thee at the law, and take a-way thy coat, let him have thy cloke al-so.

41. And who-so-ev-er shall com-pel thee to go a mile, go with him twain.

42. Give to him that ask-eth thee, and from him that would borr-ow of thee turn not thou a-way.

28_ But <u>I</u> say unto you, <u>That whosoever</u> looketh on a woman to lust after her_hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.

29_ And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.

30_ And if thy right hand offend thee, cut it off, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.

31_ It hath been said, Whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement:

32_But I say unto you, That whosoever shall put away his wife, saving for the cause of fornication, causeth her to commit adultery: and whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery.

33_¶ Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths:

34_ But <u>I</u> say unto you, <u>S</u>wear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne:

35_Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great $\underline{\mathbf{K}}$ ing.

36_ Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black.

37_ But let your communication be, \underline{Y} ea, yea; \underline{N} ay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these_cometh of evil.

 38_{-} ¶ Ye have heard that it hath been said, <u>An</u> eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth:

39_ But <u>I</u> say unto you, <u>T</u>hat ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also.

40_ And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away thy coat, let him have thy cloke also.

41_ And whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain.

42_ Give to him that asketh thee, and from him that would borrow of thee turn not thou away.

43. \P Ye have heard that it hath been said, thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy:

44. But i say un-to you, love your en-e-mies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which de-spite-full-y use you, and per-se-cute you:

45. That ye may be the chil-dren of your fa-ther which is in heav-en: for he mak-eth his sun to rise on the ev-il and on the good, and send-eth rain on the just and on the un-just.

46. For if ye love them which love you, what re-ward have ye? do not ev-en the pub-lic-ans the same?

47. And if ye sa-lute your breth-ren on-ly, what do ye more than oth-ers? do not ev-en the pub-lic-ans so?

48. Be ye there-fore per-fect, ev-en as your fa-ther which is in heav-en is per-fect.

44_ But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;

45_ That ye may be the children of your F ather which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust.

46_ For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same?

47_ And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so?

48_ Be ye therefore perfect, even as your \underline{F} ather which is in heaven is perfect.
