

SCRIPTURE PROPER NAMES.

REMARKS.

The pronunciation of Scripture Proper Names is governed chiefly by the rules which prevail in Greek and Latin.

VOWELS.

ACCENTED SYLLABLES.

When these end in a vowel, that vowel has always its *long* English sound, as in Eû'des, Esô'ra, &c.; when in a consonant, the preceding vowel has the short English sound, as in Bâs'sa, Cór'ban, &c. But *ah* has the Italian sound, as in Tâh'panes, &c.

UNACCENTED SYLLABLES.

When these end in a consonant, their vowel has the *short* English sound, as in Ba'bél, E'lim, Blas'tûs, &c. When they end in a vowel, the following cases occur: *a* final has a light Italian sound as in Du'tra; *e, i,* and *y* have the sound of *e* lightly uttered, as in Dil'e-an, An'ti-och, Eu'ty-chus. But *i,* at the end of words, has its long sound, as in It'a-i. *o* and *u* have their long sound lightly uttered, as in Gol'go-tha, Josh'a-a; *ai* (diphthong) has the sound of *i*, as in Adô'nai; *ia* following an accented *a*, has usually the sound of *ya*, as in Isa'iah (i-za'yah). But some in *aiah* have the accent on the *i* in a separate syllable, as in Shem-a-i'ah.

CONSONANTS.

C has the sound of *s* before *e, i,* and *y*, as in Ce'phas, Cith'erus, Cyre'ne; of *k* before *a, o,* and *u*, and is marked thus, C e, as in Cain, Co're, Cû'shan.

Ch has always the sound of *k*, as in Chaldea, Enoch, &c. *Rachel* has been anglicized, and is respelled.

G has its regular hard sound as in *go, give,* as in Gil'ead, &c. In Bethphage, and one or two others, the *g* has taken the sound of *f*, by passing through the Greek.

S has its regular sharp sound, as in *A'sa*, except when marked thus, S s, when it has the sound of *z*, as in Isa'iah (i-za'yah).

N. B.—The pronunciation here given is that of Walker; but in a few instances that of Perry (marked P.), of Fulton and Knight (marked F. & K.), of Trollope (marked T.), of Carr (marked C.), and of Smart (marked S.), is subjoined in notes at the bottom of the page.
